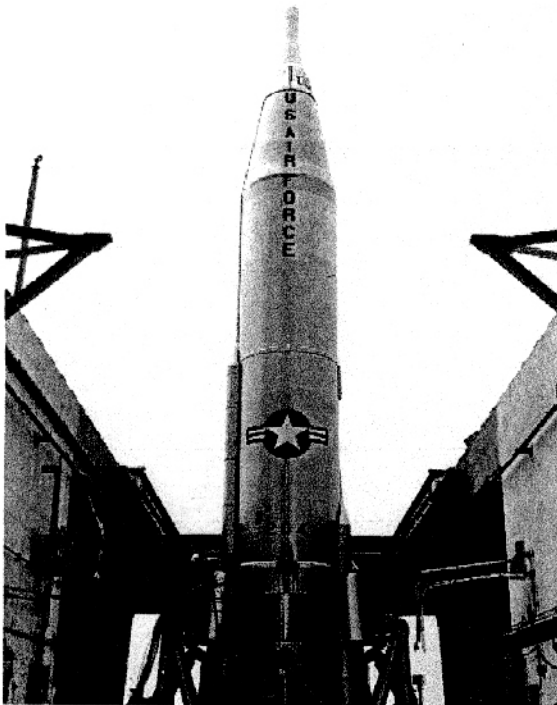




COMMANDER'S BRIEFING

Minuteman Missile National Historic Site

Mary and I are in Alaska now. On our way up here in mid May, we stopped at a new site in the National Park System. It is the Minuteman Missile National Historic Site at Cactus Flat, South Dakota

The Delta 09 silo and Delta 01 LCF are now open for tours. We scheduled a tour on the 17th of May and we are happy that we included this stop in our itinerary.

This site is located in Cactus Flat, South Dakota. It was established by the United States Congress in

1999. Its purpose is to preserve Delta-09 launch facility & Delta-01 launch control facility.

This particular Minuteman site was chosen for several reasons. It is located near a major highway (I-90 exit 131) and an existing National Park Service unit (Badlands NP). It is also the least altered from the original 1961 Minuteman configuration.

We made an appointment for our tour well in advance. We were going to be passing through this area of South Dakota and wanted to be certain a tour slot was available. Tours can only handle 6 people at a time.

We were fortunate in that our park ranger/tour guide, Kerry Davis was a Minuteman MCCC at Whiteman AFB, MO in the 80's. As may be expected, he was very knowledgeable about the system. Our tour began with a briefing at the Historic Site office at Exit 131. This briefing advised us of some of the history of the minuteman systems. We then drove west to the Launch Control Facility.

Ellsworth's above ground LCFs included security, sleeping, kitchen, exercise and power generation facilities. A short elevator trip down to the capsule brought us face to face with the huge blast door that secured the capsule. After a thorough explanation of the crew's duties and the equipment that they operated we returned topside.

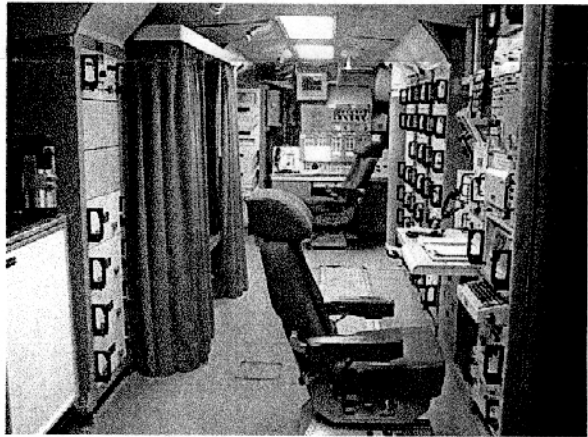
Now back into our cars we caravanned to Delta-09 at exit 166. The topside of the missile silo appears original with the exception of the overhead door. The enclosure is now glass to allow viewing of the Minuteman from directly above.

In my opinion this tour is well worth the stop if you ever in the Rapid City area.

Entry door to the launch capsule. Love the message!



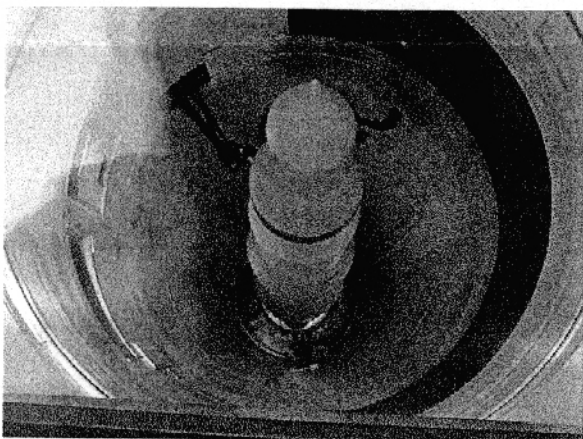
Launch control capsule.

EDITOR'S BRIEFING

We have been contacted by Charles Bounds. His father, Sgt. M.L. "Red" Bounds, was the first sergeant of the 548th for most of its existence.

If you recall, Sgt. Bounds was a big guy with ruddy complexion and red hair. I was always impressed with the medals and badges that he proudly wore. I did not know it at the time, but among those medals were the Purple Heart and the Silver Star. Among the badges were the Combat Infantryman's badge and the Paratrooper's badge.

You see, "Red" Bounds joined the Army in 1940 and was involved in most of the major European battles as a Ranger. He was wounded in Holland after a night jump into that country. In another action, he and three other Rangers rescued the son of General Terry Allen who had been captured by the Germans.

Sgt. Bounds was my idea of the consummate military man; sharp, squared away, and dedicated. He also scared me to death!

The last thing an enlisted man wanted to hear was that he was to report to the first sergeant. This usually meant that you had really messed up and that the first sergeant would meet out your punishment.

I only had to report to Sgt. Bounds one time; and that occasion was for re-enlistment counseling. I guess being scared of him is one thing that kept me from committing more serious infractions!

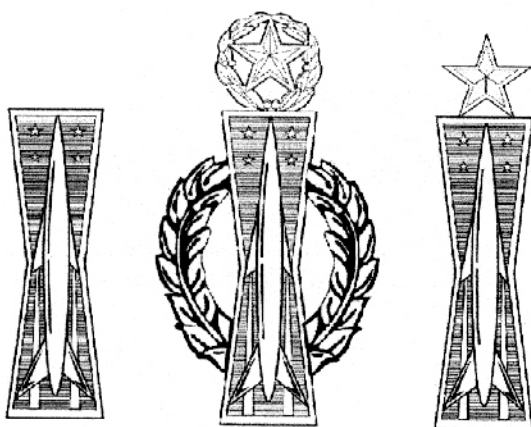
Sgt. Bounds was an avid softball pitcher and coach. He had three Air Force championships under his belt and numerous trophies on his shelves.

Sgt. Bounds retired in February, 1963. He passed away in April, 1991, and is interred at Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Ft. Worth, Texas.

The venerable "Pocket Rocket" that we all once wore with pride has evolved over time. It is scheduled to undergo even more changes in the not too distant future. In fact, the new regulations that govern the wearing of the badges may be in effect by the time you get this newsletter.

While the new regulations are still undergoing some fine-tuning, the following is a general summary.

1. The familiar basic missile badge (above, left) is to be worn by maintenance personnel who have completed missile training and a short assignment with a missile unit.
2. Maintenance personnel who have advanced to the 7 skill level will be authorized to wear the Senior badge. (above, right)
3. Maintenance personnel who have attained the 7 level and who have 5 years of experience at that level are authorized to wear the Master badge which consists of a basic badge but with a star circled by a wreath, both mounted on the top of the badge. (above, center)
4. Presently, operations personnel are authorized to wear the appropriate badge depicting skill level and longevity, but with an additional wreath affixed to the center of the badge. (above, center)

The new "space" badge is for operations personnel serving in certain space/missile oriented career fields. It will come in three varieties. The basic badge will not have a star and wreath mounted above the stylized rocket in the center. The star and wreath, when added, will denote advanced skill levels, longevity, and professional certification in the various designated career fields. At this time, we are assuming it is to be worn above the left pocket.

The old Airman First Class (E4) is now called Senior Airman but the stripe did not change. Master, Senior and Chief stripes have changed as shown below.
